

LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER

The Licensed Clinical Social Worker provides comprehensive care and customized treatment planning for children and adolescents as well as assists in developing programs that support a therapeutic campus for our youth. The primary responsibility of this position is providing a full scope of therapeutic services to children in foster care or who are homeless teens.

Some of these duties include, but are not limited to:

- Assists in developing and implementing clinical procedures and guidelines, as needed.
- Utilizes current research findings to support clinical social work services best practices on an ongoing basis.
- Ability to guide and manage a team to build and grow a therapeutic program
- Actively participates in staff meetings and case presentations.
- Assists in supervising Case Managers during initial intakes.
- Provides supervision and consultation to staff and student interns, as appropriate.
- Provides client-centered therapy interventions with an emphasis on client involvement as an integral part of the treatment team.
- Utilizes the electronic medical record to document client screenings, psychosocial assessments, progress, and referral information and completes documentation within the agency's required timelines.
- Assists in the process of advocacy for clients' access to community resources.
- Collaboratively develops treatment plans including input from the client, families, treatment team members and other agencies, as appropriate.
- Coordinates and communicates with the treatment team to provide the best care to the clients.
- Uses multiple interventions such as group, individual and family therapy to assist clients in meeting their identified goals.
- Demonstrates sensitivity to diversity issues in the assessment and treatment of clients.
- Demonstrates respect for the inherent dignity and worth of the clients.
- Actively monitors client progress towards goals and addresses termination/discharge related issues, providing outside referrals at discharge/termination, as appropriate.
- Effectively works independently and in a team environment; prioritizes workload based on workflow demands and in response to reprioritization by administrators, when needed.
- Performs other duties, as assigned
- Face-to-face counseling (Individual, Family, and Children).
- Identifying risk in the Youth Haven community by walking around, being available, and actively engaging with the community served.

- Recommending appropriate therapy referrals and handoffs based on experienced differential diagnostic skills and community resources according to the needs of children
- Develops and/or uses approved therapy, training and education programs and materials.
- Communicates information regarding trends and issues at assigned installation to supervisors.
- Participates in regular in-service training, quality improvement committees, or other contract activities as assigned.
- Participation in organization events to support and advocate for our youth

Minimum Requirements:

- A Master's degree or higher in the Behavioral Health Professions (MS/MSW/MA/PhD)
- Licensure to practice at the independent practice level (LCSW, MFT, LPCC, Psychologist) to practice in Florida
- Must be able to pass a Level II background check for employment and drug screening
- 2 years or more of post licensure clinical experience with youth a plus
